### **Pre-Installation**

### **General Information**

The fresh air adjustment panel with the hood is designed to provide up to 33% outside air. Once the hood is installed, it will allow a fixed quantity of outside air to be introduced into the conditioned space when powered.

### **Unit Inspection**

To protect against loss due to damage incurred in transit, perform inspection immediately upon receipt of the unit.

### **Exterior Inspection**

If the job site inspection reveals damage or material shortages, file a claim with the carrier immediately. Specify the type and extent of the damage on the bill of lading before signing. Notify the appropriate sales representative.

**Important:** Do not proceed with installation of a damaged unit without sales representative's approval.

- Visually inspect the complete exterior for signs of shipping damages to unit or packing material.
- Verify that the nameplate data matches the sales order and bill of lading.
- Verify that the unit is properly equipped and there are no material shortages.
- Verify that the power supply complies with the unit nameplate specifications.

### Inspection for Concealed Damage

Visually inspect the components for concealed damage as soon as possible after delivery and before it is stored.

If concealed damage is discovered:

- Notify the carrier's terminal of the damage immediately by phone and by mail.
- Concealed damage must be reported within 15 days.
- Request an immediate, joint inspection of the damage with the carrier and consignee.

Stop unpacking the unit.

### Pre-Installation

- Do not remove damaged material from receiving location.
- Take photos of the damage, if possible.
- The owner must provide reasonable evidence that the damage did not occur after delivery.



## Installation

### **BAYDMPR310\***

- 1. Open the unit disconnect switch.
- 2. Remove screws securing the filter access door and outside air panel to the unit. Do not throw out the screws; they will be used in Step 4.
- Connect the provided wiring harness to the 12-pin plug in the R/A section.
- 4. Secure the hood and damper panel to the unit outside air panel with 4 screws. (Remaining screws to be used in Step 2.)
- 5. Install the filter/mist eliminator into the fresh air hood using the spring hinge to hold it in place, as illustrated in Figure 1, p. 7.
- 6. Close the unit disconnect switch.

Figure 1. BAYDMPR310\* damper assembly




**Note:** The filter/mist eliminator can be taken out for cleaning by bending the spring hinge.

### **BAYDMPR311\***

- 1. Open the unit disconnect switch.
- 2. Remove screws securing the filter access door and outside air panel to the unit. Do not throw out the screws; they will be used in Step 3.
- 3. Secure the hood and damper panel to the unit outside air panel with 4 screws. (Remaining screws used in Step 2.)
- 4. Adjust the damper blade to the desired position setting.
- 5. Install the filter/mist eliminator into the fresh air hood using the spring hinge to hold it in place, as illustrated in Figure 2, p. 8.
- 6. Close the unit disconnect switch.
